## From Your Priest:



"Are You a Saint?"
Luke 20:27-38

Jesus must have seemed like an easy target for the Sadducees. His preaching of eternal life seemed preposterous. The Sadducees could drive a truck through the holes in his preaching. So they confront

Jesus with the proposition of the widow and her seven serial husbands, all brothers. Who is married to whom in the resurrection? This is bound to confound, and disprove. Of course, it is not the first or last time someone (maybe even you or me) will attempt to put Christ in a tidy little box tied up with string. It is very like us to conform the divine to the human, to impose our own limited sensibilities on the Word Made Flesh. We may think the Kingdom of Heaven looks pretty much the way, well, that we think it ought to look, and functions pretty much the way we think it ought to. Do we have anything in common with the Sadducees in this story?
