From Your Priest:



"Hearty Repentance and True Faith" Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptizer sets the standard for our call to new life. That call begins and ends with repentance--an opportunity to become

who God has created us to be. We engage John every year in Advent and we hear his voice crying out in the wilderness. He himself understood the act of preparation because he knew that the Messiah, the Christ, was breaking into the world. He humbled himself and offered himself in genuine repentance. We might take a moment to place ourselves in the wilderness this Advent, to get back to the essential qualities of Christian faith. What John told the law-abiding, religious people of his day made them plenty uncomfortable. His call to repentance ought to have the same effect today.
