

"If You Only Had Been Here!"

John 11:1-45

Mary, Martha, and Lazarus were like family to Jesus. Each had a distinct human personality, and Jesus loved them. The relationship Jesus

had with them is plainly visible in the case of Lazarus' death. Human struggle is vivid and graphic in their conversation. While the raising of Lazarus demonstrates

Christ's absolute power over life and death, this does not prevent Jesus from showing compassion over the genuine, human pain of this separation. He, too, is grief-stricken.

Illness and death are fixtures of the human condition. Jesus understood the heartbreak we experience in such moments. Nor did he trivialize human grief; he wept alongside his family. Christ nonetheless directs us to our own place in eternity and guides us to resurrection. We see in our Gospel lesson for this Sunday the power of the Incarnation, the merging of the human and divine.
