


Readings for This Easter Sunday

"The 'Good' This Friday"

Nobody can really say why we refer to the day of the crucifixion as "Good Friday." All sorts of etymology and cultural history gets involved in what amounts to speculation. It is a heart-

rending story that is recounted in the Church; the darkest moment in human history is observed, and no cruel or

gruesome detail is omitted. We cannot see the dawn of Easter Day without passing through the darkness of midafternoon on Good Friday.

It is a mighty temptation to move quickly past the ugliness and gore, but that avoids the truth of the matter. There is nothing sanitary or pretty about what happened to the Son of God, and how he died a real death. Each of us can see that the dividing line between good and evil runs down the center of every human heart. If we call the day "Good Friday," it ought to challenge us.

Our own Georgia Hay, M.D. who is a member of St. Mary's vestry (also Chase and Jacob's mom!) will be featured on Lampasas Radio 101.9 this Friday at 8 a.m. Georgia will discuss the Covid-19 crisis and measures like
