

"Its Always Something"
John 20:19-31

The disciples are gathered behind closed doors. They are staying away from crowds—socially isolated—but for very different reasons. In that moment, the Risen Lord makes

an appearance, his first. There is not much discussion. For

some reason, the disciple Thomas is not there. When he hears what has happened, well, naturally he is skeptical. Who wouldn't be? Perhaps the real lesson is that Thomas should have been there in the first place and wouldn't have missed it.

A week later, much has changed. Christ's presence is an established fact. Thomas is there this time, and he can see for himself. Does the Lord shame him for his doubt? No, Christ welcomes him to take a full measure of a new reality. Still, it is a blessing to trust, to have faith. That is something we can all use right now, and we can provide it to others as well.
