From Your Priest:



"Not as Orphans" John 14:15-21

Jesus demonstrates great concern for us. At the moment of his painful departure from mortal life, Jesus tells his disciples that he will not leave them (or us) orphaned. That may

take some time to sink in, because we do not typically think about grown-ups who lose their parents as being

'orphaned'—quite a different experience than it is for those orphaned at a young age. Still, that is the frame we ought to consider. Jesus is telling us that God cares for his creation in a very parental way: active, protective, nurturing, and guiding.

Jesus is not a passive observer of the human condition. He is with us, as he says, and he is living. In the lesson this week, Jesus makes clear that as he lives, so he loves the human condition. God in Christ is watchful in our hours of stress and need, very much like loving parents would be. In our time of illness and worry, that is the image we have before us.

Dear fellow members of Saint Mary's

Episcopal Church,

I hope this letter finds you all well. These are very different times. Some of you know that I am the Local Health Authority for Lampasas County, and I am doing my best to serve our community. Part of that includes me acting as others should and trying to educate everyone on how to protect our friends and neighbors. We have a congregation that is high risk and vulnerable, and many people in our congregation may be beloved caregivers for those in the vulnerable age group. I am personally asking each of you to do your best at practicing social distancing. (which I wish we could rename physical distancing, but that is another story) I do believe the time will come when in church services will be offered again, but I don't think our community is out of the woods yet. Staying further apart (6 feet) from anyone who does not live in your household and avoiding physical contact really does limit the spread of this disease. I have met many who tested positive and didn't even know it, and therefore could spread it without knowing. I am encouraging everyone to wear cloth masks in public because that also helps reduce spread. I am happy to talk to anyone individually with specific questions and would also encourage you to contact your doctor if there are more acute concerns. I am so thankful that St. Mary's is providing the online services for us to enjoy on Sunday mornings. Father Bill gets put on the big screen at our home. The boys are getting too used to church in our pajamas and allowing the cat to join us. I miss you all.
