

ST MARY'S IS HOSTING

St. Mary's will be hosting Ultreya for the Austin Convocation of the Diocese on Sunday, September 8, at 4:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Ultreya is sponsored by the Cursillo Community and is held monthly in our Austin Convocation with different



congregations serving as Host. There will be a featured speaker, music, fellowship, and of course, since we are Episcopalian, there will be food! An Ultreya is not just for those having attended a Cursillo, all are welcome and encouraged to attend.

THE BIERBOWER WINDOW

Although the golden-hued window in the south wall of St. Mary's nave may not readily attract the attention the more dramatic figural windows do, it is worthy of note both for the artistry of its glass and for the man to whom it is dedicated: Dr. James Culver Bierbower ______ (1838-1891).



The window features a hand holding a torch, symbolic of Christ as "the light of the world," and suggests the time-honored imperative of Matthew 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." Words that surround the torch, "The Lord is My Light," are the first words of Psalm 27.

The window also provides evidence of Dr. Bierbower's service "for many years warden of this church." He is credited as well on St. Mary's historical marker as being among those who were instrumental in getting the church completed in 1890. He died the next year.

In her <u>Stories of Lampasas</u>, Prima Baker Moses wrote that Dr. Bierbower was a popular dentist of the 1880s and that his office was on the second floor of the old Elks Opera House which once stood at the corner of Third and Main Streets where the Old City Hall building now stands. Apparently the opera house was in back of the building, and shops and offices fronted Third Street. Mrs. Moses also mentioned that the Bierbower home, a large two-story rock structure, was south of Sulphur Creek, near the present intersection of U.S. Hwy. 190 and Key Avenue.

Dr. Bierbower was a native of Tennessee and the son of a coach maker. He was a veteran of the Civil War, having served in the 10th Kentucky Cavalry, one of several Union regiments that were organized in that border state. The dentist and his wife Mary were married in 1868. They came to Lampasas between 1880 and 1884 with their three sons, who grew up to be leaders at St. Mary's. At least two of them were veterans of the Spanish-American War.

The Bierbower brothers' names frequently appeared in the social news of Lampasas, including one party that was held in the home of John and Harriet Manuel (also Episcopalians). The historic Manuel house is now owned by present day parishioners Jim and Pat Anderson.

Charles Gerrard Bierbower, oldest of the three brothers, attended the University of Texas at Austin, became an attorney, and served as District Clerk and City Attorney for Lampasas.

Charles and both his brothers eventually moved away, but their mother remained in Lampasas and died here in 1927. She was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in Lampasas, as were her husband, her three sons, a daughter-in-law, two granddaughters and sister-in-law, Fannie Bierbower.
